






Current Situation

- Isle of Man entered third lockdown on 3rd March 2021, once again impacting the Island's economy
- Financial support schemes for individuals, self employed and employers reintroduced within 24 hours:
 - ➤ MERA increased from £200 to £230 per week
 - > Salary Support Scheme increased from £280 to £310 per week
 - ➤ CBSS provides grant payment of £1,500 to eligible businesses equivalent to £500 per week
- Update 19 March 2021, Phased release to start from 6th, to be further developed



Support Extension

- Support schemes extended and enhanced in line with current situation:
 - MERA extended until at least 12th April 2021
 - Salary Support Scheme opened for April 2021, for same sectors as March 2021
 - CBSS further £1,000 automatic payment to those already paid
 - Additional business support grant to domestic sector businesses with premises unable to operate equivalent to 12 months rates— Provides tiered support per commercial property based on size of business
 - Further one-off payment of £250 for those hospitality businesses who voluntarily closed following Government advice on the 27/28 February
 - Tax and Customs will listen to businesses on a case by case basis





Support Costs - March

- Estimated cost for March Business Support Schemes:
 - Salary Support Scheme £8.5M
 - Manx Earnings Replacement Allowance £2.1M
 - Coronavirus Business Support Scheme £5M
 - Business Premises Grant £5M
 - Strategic Capacity Scheme £0.75M
 - Total £21M
